<u>Intent</u>

At North Wootton, our Religious Education curriculum aims to promote mutual respect, tolerance and understanding thereby effectively preparing our pupils for life in a culturally diverse modern world. We endeavor to ensure that every child leaves our school with:

- Knowledge of the principal religions represented in the UK.
- An understanding of the symbolism, practices, traditions and beliefs associated with those religions.
- The ability to ask questions and make reasoned and informed judgements about religious and moral issues.

<u>Implementation</u>

We follow the Discovery RE schemes of work which reflect the fact that the religious traditions in Great Britain are in the main Christian whilst covering Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism and Sikhism.

Religious Education is taught within discrete weekly sessions focusing on one faith-based question each half term.

Our Religious Education curriculum is compliant with The Norfolk Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education 2012.

Impact

Pupil's undertake a half termly mind-mapping exercise whereby they are asked to recall their learning and their attainment is assessed against an agreed rubric.
